Why early childhood education


- School system did not work for the youngest ones
- So, we wanted to improve
- Lack of expertise, because of change of system in the teachers training
- Scientific proof that 'play' works





Road to Erasmus+

- Expertise in The Netherlands?
- We found it in Gothenburg
- Went there with schoolprincipals
- Never heard of Erasmus+, so we paid for it ourselves
- Schoolprincipals suggested to repeat the trip with teachers in early childhood classes
- We met Erasmus+ and applied for an accreditation





International exchange with GUV

We arranged for a contract for a minimum of 5 years, in which we schedule:

- A yearly trip to Gothenburg with a so-called 'virtual school'
- Classes at Gothenburg University (GUV)
- Schoolvisits in preschools (age 1 to 6)
- Schoolvisits in preschool classes (age 6/7)
- Reflection sessions with the group
- And a lot of fun together





Obligations for particiapants

The trip is totally free of charge for our teachers, we take care of travel, hotel and meals, but we ask a few things afterwards:

- Fill in Erasmus+ survey
- Fill in survey we provide ourselves, this is to improve the quality for the next trip
- Inspire your peers in your own school
- Become a participant in our professional learning community on early childhood education




